Blues guitar is one of the most influential genres of guitar, so the best blues guitarists have had a significant impact and influence our music today. Since the late 19th century, when the African-American communities of the southern United States began to play and sing blues, this influenced and shaped other musical genres, including jazz and rock and roll. Blues can be divided into several subgenres as well, the most famous are perhaps Delta, Piedmont, Jump and Chicago blues styles. Thus, the best blues guitarists formed the music of tomorrow without knowing it. Music affects our mood, thinking, and everything about us, so these influential blues guitarists have shaped society as well. Have you ever heard anyone say, I have blues? © here is a thorough but not complete list of the best blues guitarists who helped shape and influence the music. While you're reading, play it, To get you in the mood: And if you get a sudden urge to listen to a few more blues, go ahead and check out my favorite blues albums: My list of the best leadbelly guitarists by Huddy's Heady William Ledbetter (January 1888 - December 6, 1949) was an iconic American folk and blues musician known for his strong vocals, his virtuosity on 12-string guitar, and his mastery of 12-string guitar. Although he often played twelve strings, he could also play piano, mandolin, harmonica, violin, concertina and accordion. Listen to Leadbelly Songs on Amazon by Mississippi John Hurt John Hurt (July 3, 1893-November 2, 1966) is an influential country singer and guitarist. He sang in a loud whisper, took a guitar accompaniment to his melodic finger. Hurt's influence spanned several musical genres including blues, country, bluegrass, folk and contemporary rock 'n' roll. A soft man, his nature was reflected in a work that remained a soft mix of country, blues and old music of time to the end. Listen to the Mississippi John Hurt song on Amazon's Reverend Gary Davis Reverend Gary Davis, also blind Gary Davis, (April 30, 1896 - May 5, 1972) was a blues and gospel singer and guitarist who was also experienced on banjo and harmonica. His guitar style influenced many other artists and his students. He took on a unique multi-voice style produced exclusively with a thumb and forefinger, playing not only ragtime and blues tunes, but also traditional and original tunes in the four-part Harmony Listen to Gary Davis's song on Amazon's Son House ByEd James Son House, Jr. (March 21, 1902 - October 19, 1988) was an American blues singer and guitarist. The house pioneered an innovative style featuring strong, repetitive rhythms, often played with slide guitar, and its singing often included South South and spiritual music. A seminal Delta blues figure, he remains influential today. Listen to Son House Songs on Amazon's Skip James Nehemiah Curtis Skip James (June 9, 1902 - October 3, 1969) was an American delta blues singer, guitarist, pianist and songwriter. James often played guitar with an open D-minor setting (DADFAD). James's 1931 work is considered to be a kind of pre-war blues recordings and formed the basis of his reputation as a musician. Listen to Skip James Songs on Amazon (May 28, 1910-March 16, 1975) is an American blues guitarist, singer, pianist and songwriter who is one of the most important pioneers of electric guitar. In fact, he was the first blues musician to use an electric guitar. He was #47 on Rolling Stone magazine's list of the 100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time. Chuck Berry, B.B. King and Jimi Hendrix were mostly influenced by T-Bone Walker's life and style. Listen to T-Bone Walker on Amazon's Howlin' Wolf Chester Arthur Burnett (June 10, 1910-January 10, 1976) is an American blues singer, guitarist and harmonica singer. With a booming voice and an impending physical presence, Burnett is usually among the leading performers in the electric blues. At 6 feet, 6 inches (198 cm) and close to 300 pounds (136 kg), he must have had an impressive presence with one of the loudest and most memorable voices of all classic 1950s Chicago blues singers. His rough-edged, slightly scary musical style often contrasts with the less raw but still powerful presentation of his contemporary rival, Muddy Waters. Credit for Howlin' Wolf's success should also be given to his guitarist and Blues Foundation Hall of Fame inductee, Hubert Sumlin. Listen to Howlin' Wolf Songs on Amazon (May 8, 1911 -August 16, 1938) was an American blues singer and musician. His iconic recordings from 1936-1937 showcase a remarkable combination of singing, guitar skills and song talents that have influenced generations of musicians. Johnson's dark, poorly documented life and death at the age of 27 have spawned many legends. Johnson's songs, vocal phrases and guitar style influenced a wide range of musicians; Eric Clapton called Johnson the most important blues singer that ever lived. He was ranked fifth on the list of the 100 Greatest Guitarists of All at the time by Rolling Stone. Listen to Robert Johnson's song on Amazon's Lightnin' Hopkins Sam Lightnin Hopkins (March 15, 1912 - January 30, 1982) was a country blues guitarist, from Houston, Texas. Hopkins' style was born from many hours of playing without a back-team. His distinctive fingerstyle play often included playing bass, rhythm, lead, drums and vocals, all at the same time. He played both alternating and monotonous bass styles, incorporating creative, often chromatic turns and lead lines of a single note. He added rhythmic by tapping or slapping the body of his guitar. Much of Hopkins' music follows the standard 12-bar blues template, but its wording was very loose and free. Listen to Lightning Hopkins' songs on Amazon's Muddy Waters McKinley Morganfield (April 4, 1913-April 30, 1983) is an American blues musician who is generally considered the father of the Chicago blues. Muddy went to England in 1958 and shocked the audience with his loud, enhanced electric guitar and thunderous rhythm. He was the main inspiration for the British blues explosion in the 1960s. Muddy was ranked #17 in the list of the 100 Greatest Artists of All at the time on Rolling Stone magazine's list. Listening to Muddy Waters's Songs on Amazon , John Lee Hooker John Lee Hooker (August 22, 1917-June 21, 2001) was an American blues singer and guitarist, born near Clarksdale, Mississippi. He became famous for his own unique blues style, which was originally the closest thing to Delta blues. He developed a talking blues style that looked like the early Delta blues, his music was metrically free. His own unique blues genre often included boogie-woogie piano style and driving rhythm. Listen to John Lee Hooker's songs on Amazon(January 27, 1918-May 24, 1963) is an American blues guitarist, singer, songwriter and band leader. He was known as the King of slide guitars and had a unique guitar style, known for its use of loud amplification and his exhilarating voice. James played a wide range of blues often crossing into other styles of music, similar to Muddy Waters, Howe wolf and some of B.B. King's works. However, it featured a more powerful guitar sound, which was an interestingly modified, hollow body of a traditional acoustic guitar that sounded like more modern solid-body guitars. Listen to Almore James's songs on Amazon by Albert Nelson (April 25, 1923-December 21, 1992) was an American blues guitarist and singer. He was left-handed, but usually played with his right hand guitar flipped upside down so a low row E was at the bottom. In later years he played guitar to order (Gibson Flying V, which he called Lucy), who was mostly left-handed but the strings reversed (as he used to play). He also used very unorthodox settings (i.e. setting as low as C to allow him to make wide string bends). Less than the type of blues player, he was known for his expressive bending of notes, a technique characteristic of blues guitarists. Listening to Albert King's songs on Amazon's Jimmy Reed Mathis James by Jimmy Reed (September 6, 1925 - August 29, 1976) was an American blues musician and songwriter distinguished by bringing his distinctive blues style into the mainstream. Reed was a guitarist for electric blues, as opposed to the more acoustic sound of many of his contemporaries. His lazy, sluggish-jawed singing, piercing harmonica and hypnotic guitar patterns are one of Most easily easy sounds even today. Listen to Jimmy Reed's songs on Amazon.-16 September 1925-May 15, 2015) is an American blues guitarist and songwriter known for his expressive singing and guitar playing. In rolling Stone's list of the 100 Greatest Guitarists of All Worlds, Rolling Stone magazine #3 place in the list of the best guitarists in the world. He presented an exquisite solo style based on the bend of string strings and vibrato, which will affect almost every electric blues guitarist. Listen to the songs of BB King on Amazon's Chuck Berry Charles Edward Anderson Chuck Berry (born October 18, 1926 - March 18, 2017) was an American guitarist, singer-songwriter, and one of the pioneers of rock and roll music. He refined and developed rhythm and blues into the basic elements that made rock 'n' roll distinctive, with lyrics focusing on teenage life and challenges and the use of guitar solos and entertainment that would have a big impact on subsequent rock music. Listen to Chuck Berry's songs on Amazon, Buddy Guy's Buddy Buddy Guy (born July 30, 1936) is an American blues guitarist and singer. The guy is known for his skill, playing guitar with drumsticks, or walking into the audience while playing solo. He was ranked 30th on Rolling Stone magazine's list of the 100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time. While Buddy Guy's music is often referred to as Chicago blues, his style is unique. His blues style can range from the most traditional, deepest blues to the creative, unpredictable gumbo blues, avant-garde rock, soul and free jazz that changes at every concert. Listen to Buddy Guy's songs on Amazon's Jimi Hendrix James Marshall Jimi Hendrix (born November 27, 1942 - September 18, 1970) was an American guitarist, singer-songwriter. He is often considered the greatest electric guitar in the history of rock music by other musicians and commentators in the industry, as well as one of the most important and influential musicians of his era in various genres. He was influenced by blues artists such as B.B. King, Muddy Waters, Howelyn Wolf, Albert King and Elmore James. Listen to Jimi Hendrix's Songs on Amazon by Eric Clapton Eric Patrick Clapton (born March 30, 1945) is an English blues-rock guitarist, singer, songwriter and composer. Clapton is the only person who has been inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame three times. He finished fourth on Rolling Stone magazine's list of the 100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time and #53 on the Immortals: The 100 Greatest Artists of All Time list. Although Clapton changed his musical style throughout his career, he always remained grounded in the blues; despite this focus, he is credited as an innovator in a wide variety of genres. Listen to Eric Clapton's songs on Amazon's Peter Greene(October 29, 1946 -) is a singer/songwriter/guitarist from London, UK. He played in John Mayall's Bluesbreakers and co-founded Mac. He was introduced to the rock 'n' roll hall hall in 1998, and Rolling Stone put him on the #58 in its list of 100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time. In the mid-70s, Green was diagnosed with mental health problems that broke his career in half. Despite this, many call him the greatest British blues player of all time. Listen to Peter Green's songs on Amazon's Rory Gallagher by William Rory Gallagher (March 2, 1948-June 14, 1995) is an Irish multi-instrumentalist. First playing acoustic and electric guitar, he began to sing, and then, using braces for his harmonica, Gallagher learned to play the slide guitar using a plectrom and a metal slide on his little finger. He also took possession of the alto saxophone, bass, mandolin, banjo and coral sitar, using a glass slide made from an American Coricidian bottle on his electric guitar instead of a metal slide. Listen to Rory Gallagher's songs on Amazon by Stephen Ray Vaughan (October 3, 1954-August 27, 1990) is an American Grammy-winning guitarist, singer-songwriter. He was ranked #7 in the list of the 100 Greatest Guitarists of All at the time. His blues style was influenced by many blues guitarists. The main ones were Albert King, Otis Rush, Eric Clapton, Buddy Guy and Jimi Hendrix. Vaughan's sound and style of play often included simultaneous lead-rhythm parts.
